Protecting Patients' Timely Access to Care

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Executive Summary

The Regulatory Relief Coalition (RRC) led the way in Washington, championing physicians in service of our nation's seniors on Capitol Hill and with the Administration. RRC was active in advancing policies that improve prior authorization (PA) and establish oversight of Medicare Advantage (MA) organizations through close contact with PA reform champions and staff in both the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives.

LANDMARK PRIOR AUTHORIZATION REGULATIONS FINALIZED

In January, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) finalized regulations that would require MA, Medicaid, Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), and Qualified Health Plan issuers on the federally facilitated exchanges to convey PA determinations within 72 hours for urgent requests and 7 days for non-urgent as well as requiring plans to detail a specific denial reason and report metrics publicly on PA. RRC commended CMS for finalizing these regulations and encourages future work on prescription drug PA and transparency.

MAJORITY IN CONGRESS SUPPORTS SENIORS' ACT

In June, the eight House and Senate champions introduced the *Improving Seniors' Timely Access to Care* (Seniors') Act with 42 Senate and 130 House original cosponsors. Ahead of introduction, RRC worked closely with House and Senate champions to make mindful changes to the legislation to reduce the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) score to zero. Following introduction, RRC led discussions with Hill champions to address CMS technical assistance (TA) on the bill's implementation. RRC secured support from a majority of the House (232), a supermajority of the Senate (60), and 500+ organizations.

We are confident RRC will continue to be an important resource to policymakers as they improve MA to be more transparent, efficient, and effective for seniors and the physicians who care for them.




About the Regulatory Relief Coalition



Legislative & Regulatory Highlights | 2024

RRC spearheaded initiatives reforming PA within Congress and CMS including active engagement in the introduction of the *Improving Seniors' Timely Access to Care Act.*

Improving Seniors' Timely Access to Care Act (Seniors' Act)

CLEARING HURDLES TO PASSAGE: ACHIEVING \$0 CBO SCORE

The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) is the non-partisan budget estimator for Congress that determines the cost or "score" of legislation. High scoring legislation is unlikely to pass into law. Over the course of two years, RRC worked with Congressional champions to remove any fiscal barriers to passage, ultimately reducing the \$16 billion score assigned in 2022 to \$0.

SEPTEMBER 2022

Seniors' Act passes the House by voice vote. CBO assigns a \$16B score.

MARCH 2024

RRC assists Congressional champions to modify bill.

DECEMBER 2022

CMS proposes rule that mirrors provisions of the Seniors' Act.

JUNE 2024

Newly revised *Seniors' Act* reintroduced to the 118th Congress.

JANUARY 2024

CMS finalizes rules. CBO revises score estimate to \$4B.

OCTOBER 2024

CBO assigns a \$0 preliminary score to the Seniors' Act

KEY PROVISIONS

The *Seniors*' Act would put patients over paperwork by modernizing the PA process, providing transparency, and additional oversight to the MA program:

- Establish e-PA program for MA plans including a standardization for transactions and clinical attachments.
- Increase transparency around MA PA requirements and their use.
- Clarify CMS' authority to establish timeframes for e-PA requests including expedited determinations, realtime decisions for routinely approved items and services, and any other PA request.
- Expand beneficiary protections to improve enrollee experiences and outcomes.
- Require the Secretary of HHS and other agencies to report to Congress on program integrity efforts and other ways to further improve the e-PA process.



Support for the Seniors' Act

RRC GAINS 500+ ENDORSEMENTS

More than 245 national organizations and over 255 regional, state and district organizations, representing patients, health plans, health care providers, the medical device and biopharmaceutical industry endorsed the *Seniors' Act.* RRC matched and exceeded the number of endorsers in the 117th Congress.

RRC Endorsed Legislation in the 118th Congress

RRC endorsed legislation that would reduce administrative burden for clinicians, streamline PA, and increase transparency of payers.

Letters of support are available on the RRC website.



GOLD CARD Act (H.R. 4968)

This bill would increase efficiency for physicians and enable patients to receive timely, high-quality care by allowing physicians with high approval rates to bypass prior authorization requirements imposed by MA plans.



Reducing Medically Unnecessary Delays in Care Act of 2023 (H.R. 5213)

This bill would reform PA in Medicare, MA, and Part D by requiring that all PA adverse determinations must be made by a licensed physician who is board certified in the specialty relevant to the health care item or service requested.



E-PA for Prescription Drugs Act (S. 4349)

This legislation would establish a secure electronic prior authorization process for prescription drug plans in the commercial market.




No Fees for EFTs Act (H.R. 6487/ S. 3805)

This bill would prohibit health care plans from imposing fees on health care providers for electronic funds transfers (EFTs).

All bills are expected to be reintroduced in the 119th Congress.





2024 Regulatory Efforts

CMS FINALIZES E-PA RULE

RRC championed the finalization of the e-PA rule that included provisions aligning with the *Seniors' Act*. The rule was finalized on January 17, 2024, and the RRC published a press release in support. RRC produced a detailed side-by-side comparison for members to analyze the regulation compared to versions of the *Seniors' Act*.

CMS FINALIZES CY 2025 MA RULE

RRC supported the finalization of key utilization management provisions and wrote comments in support of this proposed rule in early 2024. This final rule would require MA plans to hire a health equity expert to review policies, conduct annual health equity analyses of prior authorization data, and publicly post the health equity analysis results.

PA DEMONSTRATION FOR AMBULATORY SURGICAL CENTER SERVICES

RRC submitted comments to CMS on the Prior Authorization Demonstration for Ambulatory Surgical Center Services, which would require Ambulatory Surgical Centers to obtain prior authorization before providing certain surgical procedures. RRC provided several questions to CMS about this demonstration and expressed concerns regarding the proposed information collection activity.

REQUEST FOR INFORMATION ON MA DATA

RRC responded to CMS' Request for Information about additional data collection that may be useful with respect to the MA program. In the comments, RRC emphasized that additional data collection from MA plans can provide additional oversight into the impact of prior authorization.








Public Engagement Highlights | 2024


RULE FINALIZATION CAMPAIGN | JANUARY 2024

2025 RRC AGENDA

CHAMPIONING REGULATORY RELIEF FOR PATIENTS AND CLINICIANS AS THE LEADING COALITION ON THE HILL FOR PA & MA POLICY.

Passing the *Seniors' Act* will be the logical next step for this new Congress, to ensure codification of the important policies in bipartisan legislation. RRC is already leading conversations on the Hill to encourage swift passage.

Expanding the work of RRC beyond MA. The *Seniors' Act* has already encouraged lookalike legislation including applying electronic prior authorization and transparency policies to commercial plans.

Continuing to champion legislation that expands protections in the *Seniors' Act* to prescription drugs in MA, Medicare Part D, and other payors. RRC is already being enlisted for endorsements in 2025.

Engage Secretary of Labor and the agency's Office of the Inspector General to investigate the use of PA by ERISA plans and support ERISA PA reform in Congress.

Investigating other MA plan abuses that deny and delay care for patients such as post-service payment denials, recoupments, and PA repeals processes.

Continuing to monitor and submit comments on upcoming CMS proposed rules related to MA and PA. The use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) is an important issue for regulations, and there will be more clarity in 2025 in how CMS and other federal agencies plan to address it.

Fighting to protect the final rules on e-PA and MA that establish prior authorizations protections for beneficiaries. Monitoring the implementation and enforcement of the new PA provisions at CMS.
